Tuvalu has received financing from the World Bank for the *Pacific Islands Regional Oceanscape Program* (PROP). PROP comprises a series of projects, which includes separate but complementary national projects in the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, Tuvalu, the Solomon Islands, Kiribati, Samoa and the Kingdom of Tonga, and a separate but complementary regional project implemented by FFA.

The PROP development objective is to strengthen the shared management of selected Pacific Island oceanic and coastal fisheries, and the critical habitats upon which they depend. This will provide the basis for sustainable and increased economic benefits to the participating Pacific Island countries from this resource.

This consultancy aims to review and introduce fisheries legislation for the conservation and management of the Funafuti lagoon particularly the Conservation Area in Funafuti through the Funafuti Reef Fish Stewardship Plan (FRFSP). These legislation will ensure the effective management of marine resources for food security.

BACKGROUND

The PROP project in Tuvalu has dedicated to supporting the Funafuti Reef Fish Stewardship Plan (FRFSP) over the years. The Funafuti Reef Fisheries Stewardship plan, which was developed through a process of stakeholder consultation, calls for sustainable management of reef fish in Funafuti. The FRFSP strategy 1 strengthening the Funafuti Conservation Area, strategy 2 fish size limit and strategy 4 ensure everyone is involved and invested are the key objectives of the Funafuti fisheries plan.

The consultant will work with the Fisheries Department and Kaupule Funafuti to identify fisheries legislation and bye laws that needs to be reviewed and introduced. The consultant will help the FRFSP strategies fulfill and move forward. The documented legislation assures the implementation of the

Funafuti Fisheries Plan. Those legislation will promotes the strengthening of the Funafuti Conservation Area and the sustainable management of the marine resources in Funafuti lagoon.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the consultancy is to review and introduce a new fisheries legislation to strengthen the sustainable management of the Funafuti Conservation Area and the Funafuti fishery as a whole.

OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the consultancy is to review, develop and introduce fisheries legislation to be in line with the Funafuti Reef Fish Stewardship Plan.

SCOPE OF WORK

- Consult with the Kaupule Funafuti and Fisheries Department through legislations that needs to be review
- Conduct a review of fisheries related legislation, regulations, bye-laws including plans;
- ➤ Consult with stakeholders the need for a legislation to support the FRFSP;
- > Develop appropriate legislation to be in-line with marine regulatory framework;
- Review and formulate legal process in consideration with the Funafuti Reef Fish Stewardship Plan
- > Draft a legislation based on the outcome of fish size limit study and spawning aggregation sites survey for the Funafuti Lagoon;
- > Present the legislations to the Kaupule Funafuti & Fisheries Department
- Assist the Kaupule Funafuti in formulating their fisheries by elaws to support the FRFSP

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

The immediate outcome is to formulate and introduce fisheries legislation to strengthen sustainable fisheries activities

The long term outcome is to have documented fisheries legislation that allows Government bodies, NGO's and the public to be aware of the importance of the FRFSP. The legislations will primarily ensure a sustainable management of marine resources and a secure food security for the people of Funafuti.
