Position summary:

The Assistant Fisheries Officer – Oceanic Compliance supports the other officers in the section in fisheries compliance activities, monitors foreign fishing vessel movements in Tuvalu's EEZ, participates in boarding and inspection activities of foreign fishing vessels and investigates reported violations.

Main responsibilities:

- Monitor the movement of foreign fishing vessels fishing in Tuvalu's EEZ
- Maintain a register of entry and exit of foreign fishing vessels and the weekly report received from foreign fishing vessels fishing in Tuvalu's EEZ
- Prepare and provide reports on foreign fishing vessel movements and activities in Tuvalu's EEZ
- Investigate reported violations by Tuvalu flag vessels reported through the WCPFC or PNA compliance case file systems and recommend action
- Monitor and recommend approval of port entry requests
- May be involved in boarding foreign fishing vessels at sea
- Participate in boarding & inspections of foreign fishing vessels in port
- Assist in coordinating the monitoring of transhipment in port
- Verify and complete transshipment monitoring information on catch certificates of foreign vessels
- Undertake other duties as required
